Customized Curriculum

Leadership Fellows convene to learn critical leadership skills. The customized curriculum includes:

An immersive 3-day orientation,

using trust- and cohort-building techniques and a proprietary communication skills methodology.

An intensive 4-day program at INSEAD,

focused on leading across cultures, disciplines, and functions, exploring leadership styles through the GELI 360° review, and resulting in action plans for use in the Fellows' organizations.

An exclusive week-long experience at Harvard Business School,

concentrating on influencing and enacting change, obstacles often faced by women leaders, and strategies to lead change effectively. Working in small groups, participants apply the lectures and lessons to a current professional challenge.

Virtual masterclasses with IWF thought leaders,

on topics such as authentic leadership, effective networking, the importance of failure, owning your confidence, and promoting allyship and mentoring.

Legacy Project

The Legacy Project, a program requirement, brings benefits back to the Fellows' organizations and communities and lifts others by sharing what they have learned. Fellows' projects have ranged from engaging girls in STEM, organizing leadership training within sponsoring organizations, building new industry, company, or community networks, and producing a mentoring handbook to engage BIPOC women.

Anita Roy (2021-2022 Leadership Fellow and Deputy Commissioner, Delhi Police Department, India) designed and conducted an innovative training program teaching police officers to respond to cyber-crimes against women, with 15 graduates (pictured) in the first class.

Selection Criteria

Each year, IWF selects a geographically, culturally, ethnically, and professionally diverse group of up to 45 leaders who are 4-8 years from the C-suite (or equivalent levels in their fields, such as senior leaders in academia and government and founders and C-level leaders of entrepreneurial and social-impact ventures and nonprofit organizations). In this competitive process, IWF seeks candidates that demonstrate:

- A track record as a change agent within their organization and community
- Ambition to push to the highest levels of their career and demonstrated desire to support colleagues' advancement
- Substantive professional/work experience and significant direct accomplishments
- Strength of character, motivation, and commitment to goals
- Superior intellectual ability and interpersonal intelligence
- Capacity to both contribute to and gain from the Leadership Fellows Program
- Commitment to participate fully in all program activities and training components including completion of a Legacy Project

While designed for women leaders (and likely most beneficial to those who identify as such), the program is open to all who otherwise fulfill the admissions criteria.

Tuition

Program tuition is \$32,750 (USD), including:

- Immersive 3-day orientation
- IWF World Leadership Conference and Gala
- Customized training at INSEAD and Harvard Business School
- · Mentoring focused on individual needs
- Meals and accommodations
- All course materials

Transportation (ground and air travel) is not included.
